

Regulatory Update – Eurasian Customs Union

Update to Technical Regulation “On Restriction of Hazardous Substances in Electrical and electronics products”

Further to PCS’ Regulatory Update released on 17th January 2017, the European Eurasian Commission has published an update to proposed enforcement of Technical Regulation “On Restriction of Hazardous Substances in electrical and electronic products”.

According to the Decision No 24 published on 28th February 2017, a two-year grace period has been offered in order for manufacturers to become familiar with new regulation and for Certification Bodies to obtain all necessary accreditations. Electrical and Electronic Equipment without the said approval can be sold/imported on the territory of Customs Union (CU) until 1st March 2020. Furthermore, only devices newly released on the market will require the CU Restriction of Hazardous Substances (RoHS) approval from 1st March 2020. Products already on the market will not require additional conformity assessment.
